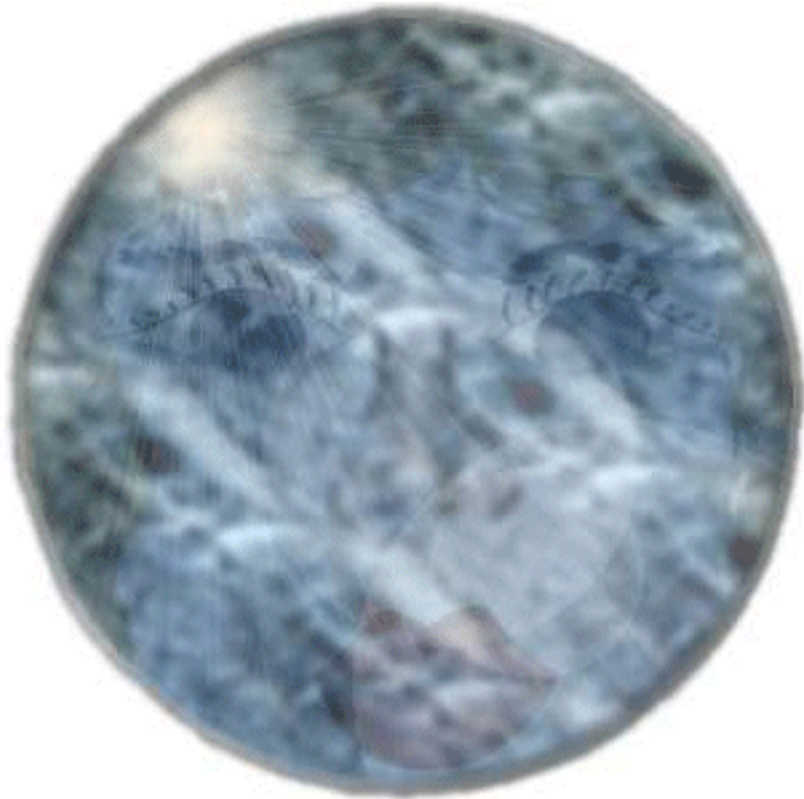


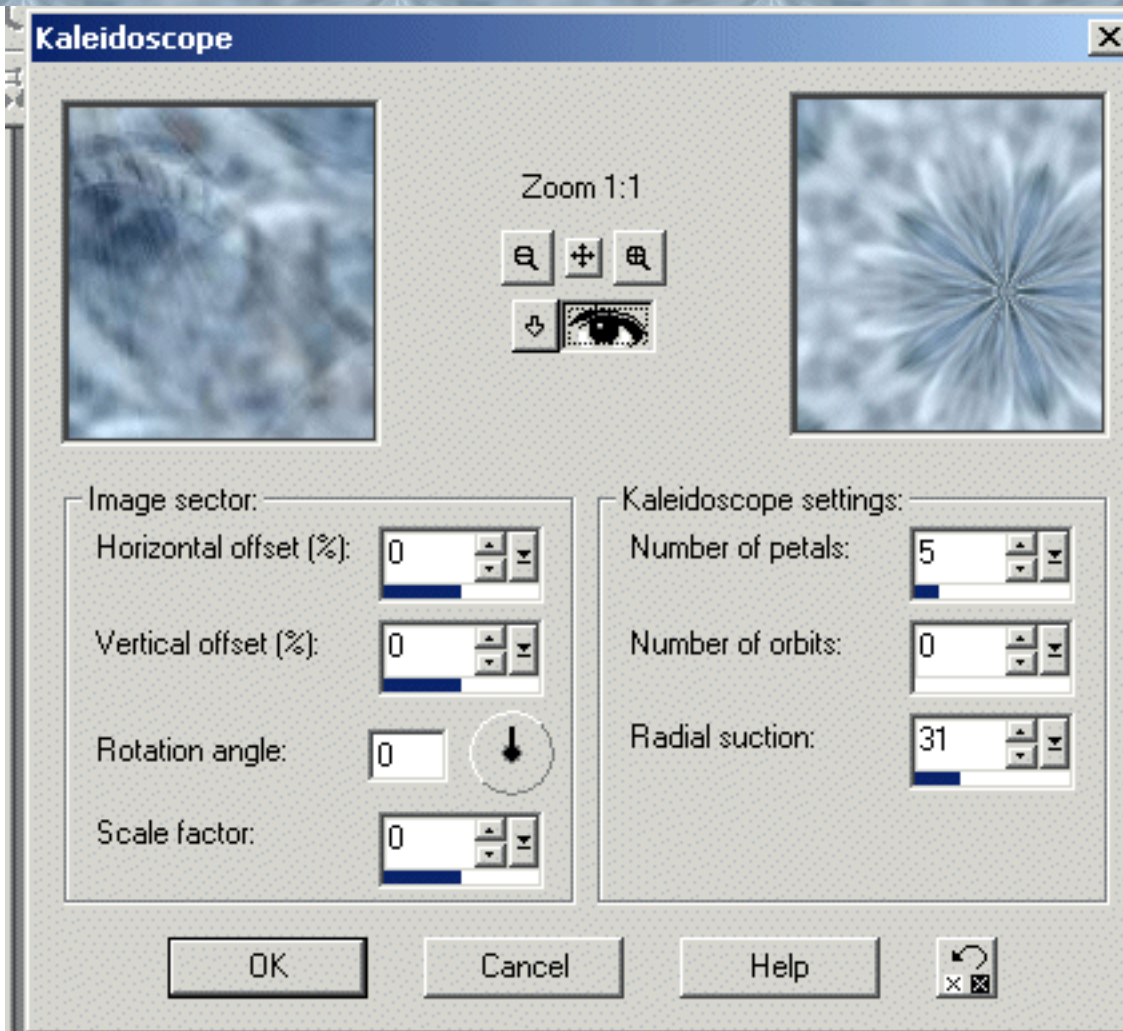
Easy Kaleidoscope Background

This tutorial will make the background on this page. Try it with other images to make a variety of backgrounds.

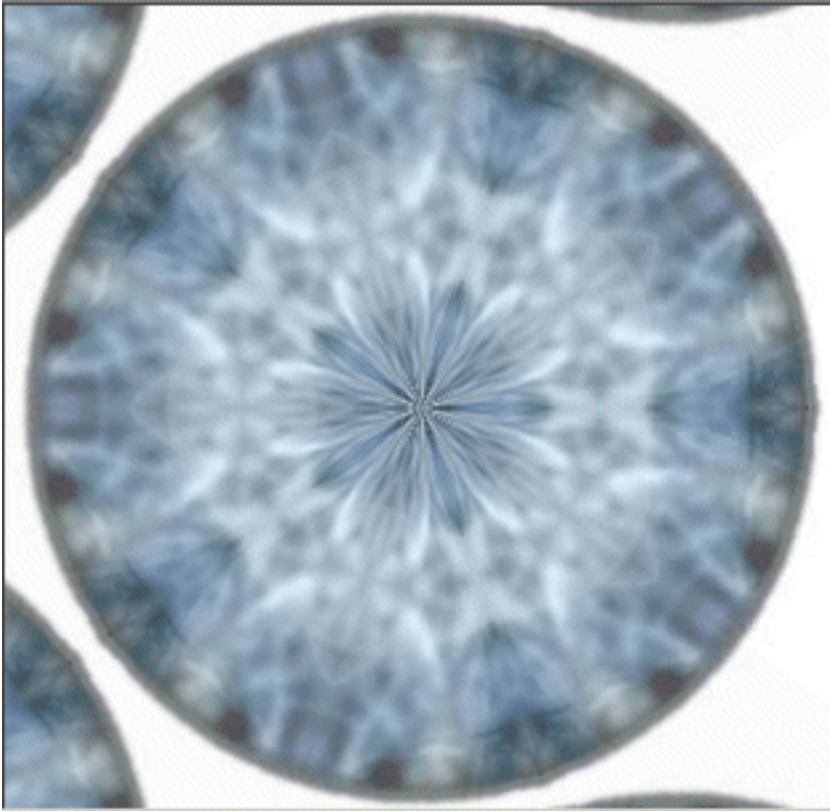
1. Save the image below and open it in Psp, duplicate to give you a new image to work with and close the original image. Or use any image of your choosing.



2. Choose effects->reflection effects->kaleidoscope [Click for help locating](#)
Use the following settings.

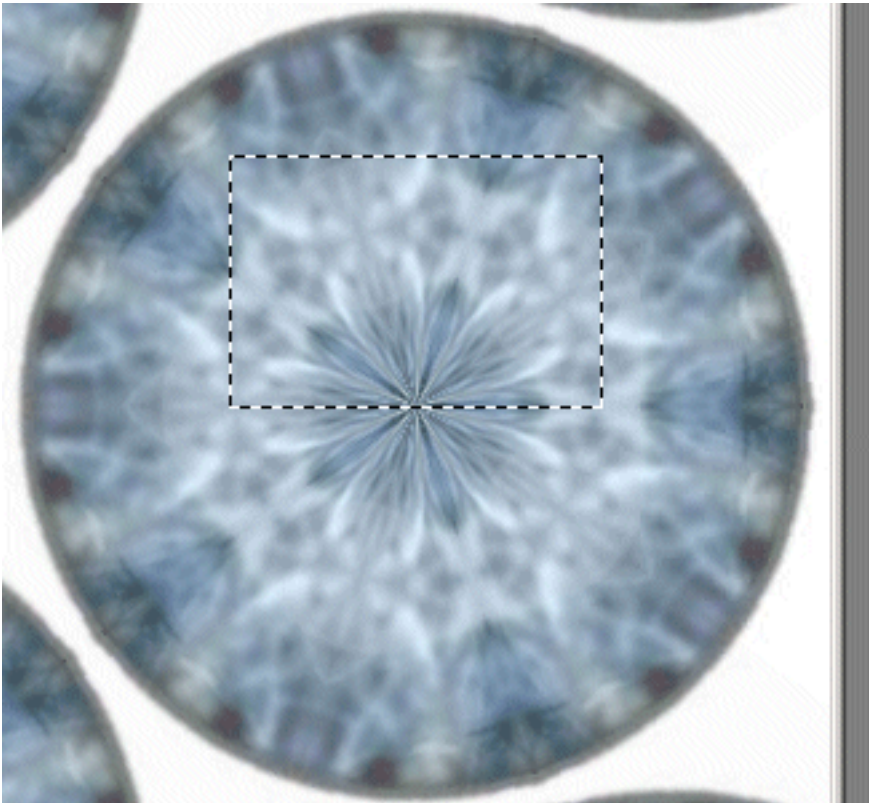


You will now have the following strange result, don't worry it's not an error and will all come out alright in the end.



3. Now choose selection type rectangle, feather=0 antialias not checked [Click for help locating](#)

Draw out a rectangular selection over a part of the image that looks interesting. The image below shows the area I chose.



4. Choose selection->convert to seamless Pattern [Click for help locating](#)

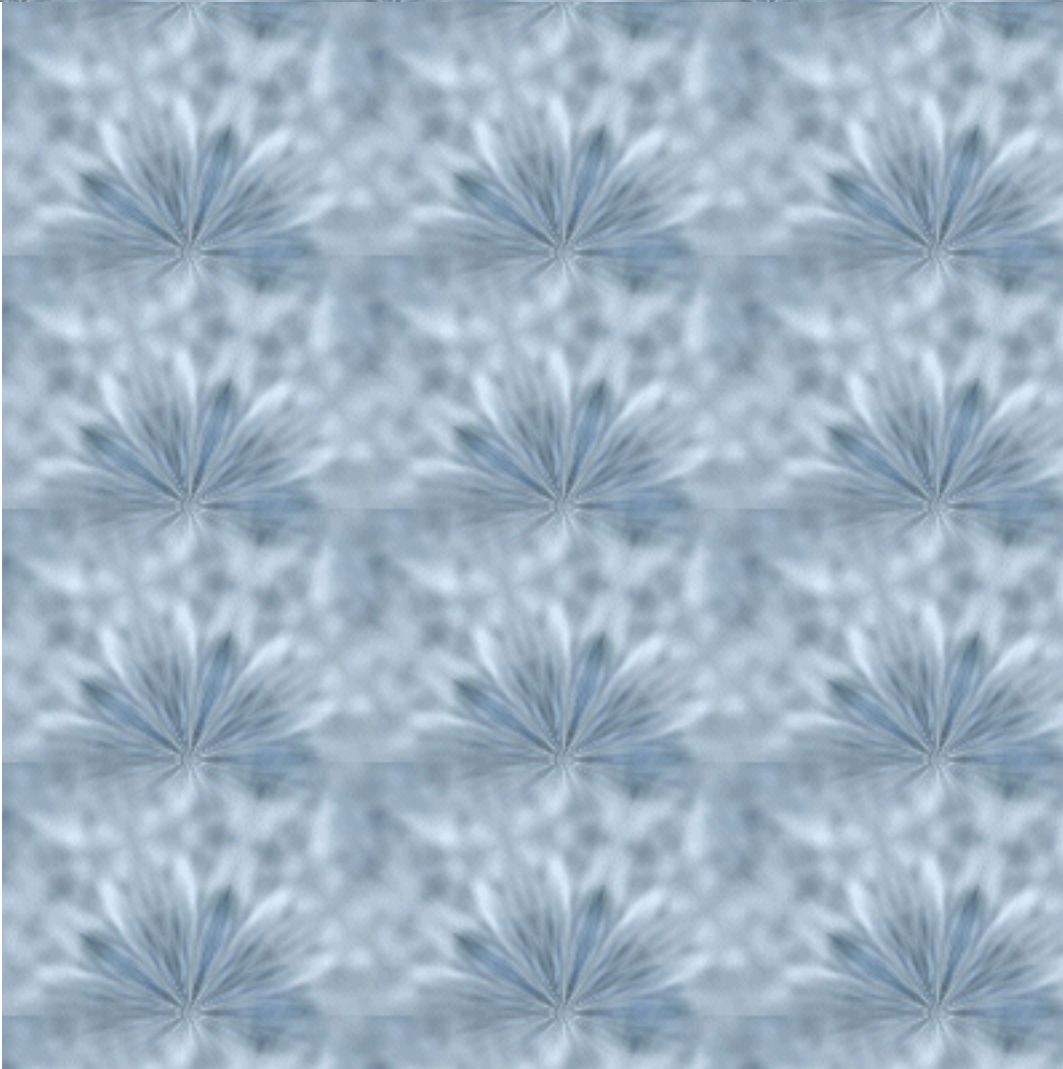
This will creat the tile below, or something similar if you have used your own image.



4. Now you need to test your tile. Load it into the background palette. Click arrow A as shown on the image below to show the small palette, choose the pattern icon (B on image) This will open up the pattern palette ([Click here for image](#)) locate your tile and click on it to load it as the active palette (C on image)



5. Open a new 400 by 400 image and floodfill with your background. As you can see from the image below this background tiles just fine. Save your small file as a gif ready to use as a backbround or offer for download from your site.
